NOTICE TO MEMBERSHIP

May 16, 2023

This announcement is directed specifically to the members of the Upper Nicola Band.

The Chief and Councillors of the Band have most recently been involved in dealing with social media posts that complain of certain deficiencies in the recent custom election. The allegations of impropriety and wrongful conduct were made in social media by one of our members. While Chief and Council have also been dealing with the member directly, Council has some concern over the effect that those social media posts may have in the community. Any matters of election behaviour or other decisions made by Band officials are made according to policy or regulation. If those behaviours or decisions cause members difficulty, then, as in this case, there are specific ways, also set out in the regulations to deal with those difficulties. Those specific ways do not include social media posts.

Please be fully aware that the allegations set out in the social media posts are in the view of the Chief and Council, untrue, and have no basis in fact. The Band's appeal processes are set up to determine whether or not facts alleged by complainants are true. Please do not assume them to be true just because you have read a social media post. The Band's appeal processes have not been used by the member.

If you have concerns over this Notice to Membership, we invite you to learn what the Band's processes are and how to use them instead of social media. This will save a great deal of frustration, aggravation and discontent.

We remind you that you should not distribute any social media that contains unfounded allegations. That is just as bad as publishing those allegations in the first instance.

The Band has taken the step of issuing this public announcement in an effort to reduce and hopefully eliminate the harm that can take place due to any misdirected impressions of the Chief and Council and the Band's administration. Please ask about any of the procedures you may wish.

While the member's most recent allegations targeted others connected with the Band, this public announcement is not meant to answer the legal response of others. Those people, being targeted as they were, may wish to pursue their own remedy and this announcement is not intended to advise them in any way.



Bitter-root (Lewisia rediviva)

Other names: Sand Rose, Desert Rose, Rock Rose, Spatlum, Spitlum, and Speetlum, NIa ? k'w epn.

Background


Bitterroot is in the Purslane family (Portulacaceae). Lewis and Clark found the prepared roots to be too bitter for their taste, so they called it "bitterroot." When Lewis' pressed and dried specimen was examined months after picking, it still showed signs of life and upon planting, it grew – hence the scientific name *rediviva* meaning "restored to life" (Parish et al 1996).


Plant Morphology

Bitterroot is a low, fleshy perennial, 1-3 cm tall. Flowers arise from a deep, thick, branched taproot with a short, woody base. Leaves are all basal and linear and are usually dried and withered by flowering time. Flowers are showy, deep pink to sometimes white on a short stalk close to the surface of the soil. They resemble the flowers of the water-lily and open only in the sun (Parish et al 1996).

Ecology

In British Columbia, bitterroot occurs on dry, sandy or gravelly sagebrush plains and grassland slopes on lower elevations (Kuhnlein and Turner 1991). Figure1 shows the biogeoclimatic zones and subzones bitterroot can be found in the southern interior of BC (Province of BC – Ministry of Forests 1983).





Food

The thick, fleshy roots of bitterroot were an important food source for Interior First Nations such as the Upper Nlaka'pamux, southern Secwepemc Okanagan, and Ktunaxa (Kuhnlein and Turner 1991). Other neighbouring nations obtained bitterroot through trade. At the turn of the century it was reported that ten bundles of bitterroot were equivalent in trade for one large, dressed buckskin (Ibid.). The roots are plentiful in mid May and best picked before the flower blooms otherwise the outer skin sticks to the root, is very hard to peel and becomes woody. The roots were dug using a digging stick made of saskatoon or similar hard wood. Once extracted, they were promptly peeled and the small red "heart" (the embryonic next season growth) was removed to reduce the bitter flavour (Kuhnlein and Turner 1991). Large quantities of the roots were dried but they were also steamed, boiled, pit-cooked and eaten fresh and almost always mixed with other foods such as Saskatoon berries (Ibid).

Recipes

2 cups dried saskatoons4 tbsp dried bitterrootSugar to taste

Put in a pot and add water. Boil until the consistency of applesauce. Some people like to add flour as a thickener. Eat hot or cold.

Bitterroot can also be mixed with fish eggs, saskatoons and flour. Cook to a custard or pudding consistency. If eaten as a main meal, salt would be added; if eaten as desert, sugar would be added.

Medicine

Kershaw reports that various First Nations prepared a bitterroot tea to treat trouble and pleurisy, to increase milk flow after childbirth and purify the blood and to relieve associated skin problems and diseases (2000).

Warning

Dried bitterroot swells in the stomach, so it should be consumed in moderate quantities (Kershaw 2000).

Note

Bitterroot is becoming increasingly hard to locate due to overgrazing, human development and invasion of exotic species. Do not add to the peril of this beautiful and delicate flower by harvesting the plant in areas where it is scarce. There are a few areas where it is plentiful, sampling it should not prove to be too harmful.

The Director of Community Services is responsible for managing and supervising positions under the authority of the Upper Nicola Band Community Services (Capital Works, Operations and Maintenance and Housing).

Duties and Responsibilities:

The Director of Community Services is responsible for the overall day-to-day management, administration, and delivery of UNB's Capital Works (O&M) and Housing programs and services, within approved budgets, to ensure the capital works and housing needs of members are met in a responsible, efficient, and fair manner.

The Manager provides direction and supervision to the Community Services Department staff to ensure all planned programs and services of the department are delivered in accordance with (i) UNB Personnel Policies, Financial Administration Law, policies, and regulations and (ii) the program policies and regulations of AANDC.


