

Dr. Jeanne Paul is a Coast Salish native from the Tla'amin Band. She graduated from the Naturopathic Medical University of Portland, Oregon in 1991. She has become the first, First Nations to graduate in this profession for Canada. In her semi-retirement from a Family Practice, she now dedicates her professional career as a Consultant on First Nations Issues focusing on the Traditional Medicines of B.C. Always focusing on how to bring these medicines to the 21st century and melding the Western Medicine with the Traditional Medicines. In 2007, Dr Paul received the honor of being the Doctor of the year, again achieving the honor of being the first, First Nations to receive this honor for Canada.

The twelve lectures pertain to the 12 body systems and how to look after these systems using our Traditional Medicines. Following these lectures will help to understand a little of how the body works and how to heal them using these traditional medicines.



# CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE IN SYILX TERRITORY



Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) has been confirmed in two deer southeast of Cranbrook in the Kootenay region of British Columbia on February 1st, 2024. CWD is a fatal neurological disease affecting cervids like deer, elk, moose, and caribou, with long incubation periods. Infected animals can appear healthy. CWD concerns the Syilx Nation and wildlife managers due to its threat to cervid populations and food sovereignty. Testing for harvested animals in affected and non-affected areas is highly recommended. Instructions and drop-off locations for testing animals can be found below.

### REMOVE HEAD AND TAG

All harvesters are encouraged to provide samples after harvesting a elk, moose, deer, or caribou in Syilx Territory.



### REMOVE ANTLERS AND BAG

Remove any antlers and remove the head from the body with at least 3 inches of neck attached to the skull.



### **DROP-OFF LOCATIONS**

Deposit all harvested deer heads within one week of harvest to one of the designated drop-off locations.

Ear tags, zip ties and garbage bags will be supplied at the freezer locations.



#### **REGISTRATION & LOGIN**

Registering for an account is quick and easy, just follow the steps below:

You will need to provide: Personal Health Number, phone number, email and home address with postal code

#### **Eligible Patients**

Register yourself, family members, and/or persons in your care if each person resides within the <u>Merritt</u> local health area

#### **Ineligible Patients**

Persons who already have a family doctor or nurse practitioner in Merritt OR do not currently live in the Merritt area OR do not have a personal health number\*
\*PHN is found on the BC Services Card

You will be contacted as soon as a provider has capacity to accept you as a patient. We are not able to provide an estimated timeline or any indication of your position on the list but it is expected to take some time and your patience is appreciated.
