Purpose

Upper Nicola Band (UNB) is seeking proposals from interested Consultants to assist with facilitation of a UNB *i?* $nq^wlq^wiltntət$, *i?* $sqlx^wcawtət$ (Our Language, Our Ways) Strategic Planning Session.

Contract will include:

- 1. Pre-facilitation orientation of the community, vision of the Upper Nicola Band, current state of UNB plans and priorities, and understanding the Four Pillars Society Community Plan requirements.
- 2. Facilitation of a two-day session *i? nq^wlq^wiltntət, i? sqlx^wcawtət (Our Language, Our Ways)*Strategic Planning Session. (2 days in the month of February 2025, date to be confirmed, NVIT -Merritt).
- 3. Final Deliverable will be the UNB *i?* $nq^wlq^wiltntət$, *i?* $sqlx^wcawtət$ (Our Language, Our Ways) Strategy, with Action Plan and proposed budget for UNB, by March 21,2025.

Background

Upper Nicola Band, of the syilx (Okanagan) Nation, with a membership of approximately 1000 members. Upper Nicola is located 45 km east of Merritt and 90 km south of Kamloops, British Columbia, Canada. Upper Nicola has eight reserves located near Nicola Lake and Douglas Lake. Upper Nicola's two main residential communities are n'iqiləmix Nicola Lake (IR #1), and Spaxomin (Douglas Lake). The reserves comprise approximately 31,000 acres that span a range of 50 kilometers along Highway 5A and the Douglas Lake Road.

We have several Departments that all provide essential services to our members: nsyilxcən language, kwu stemtima? (Our Grandmothers), Community Safety, Health, N'kwala School, Education and Headstart/Daycare. We receive funding from Federal and Provincial Governments to implement some of these services.

UNB is recipient of a class action suit regarding the loss of culture and language. (Refer to Four Pillars Society for more information https://fps-lchw.ca/). We will receive sustainable funding over 20 years, to compensate for:

- Pillar 1: Revival and Protection of Indigenous Language
- Pillar 2: Revival and Protection of Indigenous Culture
- Pillar 3: Protection and Promotion of Heritage
- Pillar 4: Promotion of Wellness of Indigenous Communities and People

To access the funding, we must submit a 5–10-year community plan on how we will utilize funds aligned with the Four Pillars.

We would like to have engage each Department to understand how this funding model may be applied to each groups' initiatives as related to the Four Pillars and how we can work collaboratively to identify the needs and plans of the community for the next 5-10 years.
