



HCAP INDIGENOUS EXPANSION (IX)

Explore Our Health Career Access Program (HCAP)

The <u>Health Career Access Program</u> is a paid working and training position for individuals excited to start a career in health care. HCAP students will receive a full-time wage while completing a paid training program as a Health Care Assistant (HCA) at a participating post-secondary institution.

After completing 6 - 12 months of full-time post-secondary training, participants begin work at their interior health work site or community site. Here, they will fulfill a 12-month return of service contract in exchange for the funding they received. Employment options for health care assistants include hospitals, long-term care facilities, hospice and palliative care facilities, rehabilitation centers, community health centers, mental health facilities, home care agencies, and private clinics.

Return-of-Service

Participants will owe a 12-month Return-of-Service upon graduation from the Health Care Assistant program and receiving their BC Care Aide (BCCA) registration.

Participants who do not fulfill the Return-of- Service will have to repay the funding. Indigenous participants will have a choice to complete their Return-of-Service within a First Nation community or maintain their employment with Interior Health and/or both.

Application Assistance

To better support our Indigenous community throughout the application process, Interior Health offers the services of Indigenous Employment Advisors. They are available to provide valuable insights and assistance in various areas, including resume building, interview practice, and general application guidance.
